COMMISSIONER APPLICANT NAMES

As you may recall, staff is working at drafting a revised Resolution regarding the City's Commissioner application process and the public availability of applicant information. The resolution is scheduled to return to the Council's October 9th meeting. In the meantime, staff will be placing information regarding the applicant names for all vacant Commission seats – on the City's website. This will provide easy access for the public to the applicants' names. The current listing should be on the City's website before August 10th.

OVERSIGHT BOARD MEETINGS

Assembly Bill 1484 made a number of changes to the process of dissolving Redevelopment Agencies. A few of the changes resulted in the necessity to schedule additional Oversight Board Meetings. The following Oversight Board meetings are currently scheduled.

UPCOMING COUNCIL MEETING ITEMS

Please note this is staff’s best estimate of the scheduling of future agenda items. This schedule is subject to revision as agenda items may be rescheduled to a future meeting, and are occasionally moved forward. Items may be rescheduled due to staff needing additional time to complete an item, too many items on a single agenda, or other issues impacting scheduling. Items are not listed in the order that they will appear on the Council’s agenda. Additionally, agenda items are occasionally dropped from the list. (Agenda items are only deleted when it is a staff generated item that is no longer necessary, or if a Council Member withdraws a requested item.) Lastly, the Mayor determines the scheduling and order of agenda items.

(Please note, due to the August recess, the September 11th and 25th agendas have a significant number of action items – most likely agenda items will be re-scheduled to October and November meetings – but the determination of which specific will be made closer to the date of the meetings.)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

SIERRA MADRE FARMERS MARKET

The City received a check in the amount of \$346.56 that covered the Farmers' Market during the period of June 20, 2012 and July 11, 2012, noting that the Farmers' Market was cancelled on July 4th.

WATERWORKS AQUATICS MEET AND GREET EVENT

Waterworks Aquatics hosted another *Meet and Greet* event on Saturday, July 28th at the Sierra Madre Aquatic Center. In attendance were Community Advisory Board Members, Joan Spears, Mona Anich, Community Services Commissioner Leslee Hinton, staff liaison Kristi McClure, City Manager Elaine Aguilar, Waterworks Aquatics staff and members of the public. Waterworks Aquatics staff presented an overview of the changes and programs at the pool. The majority of questions were about scheduling swim lessons and whether or not the Swim Team will be available in fall. Overall, the changes to the WaterWorks program were well received.

SPLASH INTO SUMMER SAFETY

Splash into Summer Safety with Waterworks Aquatics and the Sierra Madre Fire Department took place on Tuesday, July 31st. A live demonstration of a “Mock” drowning water rescue took place with Mona Anich (as the mother) and her son being rescued by her. The crowd saw first-hand at what to do when a drowning occurs. The event included FREE recreational swim for the community until 12pm

PARKS AND FACILITIES MASTER PLAN COMMITTEE

The Committee met on Tuesday, July 31st at the Community Recreation Center. The Committee toured City facilities and parks to review their recommendations for improvements and goals of the master plan. The next Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 16th at the Community Recreation Center. Items on the agenda will include determining project levels of priority and develop an action plan for the implementation of the master plan.

ARTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE - ARTIST EXHIBIT & RECEPTION

Celeste Mendelsohn art will be taken down from City Hall on Thursday, August 2nd. City staff is working with a jewelry artist for a possible future art exhibit and reception. Followed by the Creative Arts Scarecrow Festival entries will hopefully be on display at City Hall for the month of November.

COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION

The Community Services Commission has cancelled their regular meeting on August 20, 2012. The Commission is adjourned until their next regular meeting on Monday, September 17, 2012.

ADULT SOFTBALL

The umpires have had difficulty keeping track of the score during the game after each inning. It has also been brought to the attention of staff that umpires need to be corrected occasionally with the correct amount of runs scored. This becomes problematic if the error is noticed an inning or two after the runs have scored. Since there is no official scorekeeper, the runs from previous innings cannot be counted even if they were scored.

Another concern is when a team that plays the first game forfeits. The first team that plays is responsible for field set-up, however, if they forfeit their game there is no team to set-up the field and if this occurs on a Sunday there is no one to communicate the forfeit.

Staff is reviewing options to address these issues prior to the start of the season.

CONCERTS IN THE PARK

The next Concert in the Park is sponsored by the L.A. County Arts Commission. The band, TAIKOPROJECT, is a drum ensemble that will incorporate patron interaction at the end of their performance. The concert is at the Memorial Park Bandshell from 6:00pm-8:00pm.

The Sierra Madre Civic Club hosted the concert this past Sunday, July 29. The Civic Club reported their fundraising for the event went very well, generating a lot of revenue for their philanthropic fund. The band was the Aluminum Marshmallow, which previously participated in the concert series.

SENIORS

City Councilmember John Capoccia will host the August Lunch and Learn program at the Hart Park House. Councilmember Capoccia is joining the seniors for lunch on August 8, 2012 at 12:15pm and will give an update of general city information.

The August Senior Moments Newsletter was completed on Wednesday, August 1. The August newsletter included information on excursions, the Lunch and Learn program, and a free senior day at the Aquarium of the Pacific. The newsletter was mailed to just under a hundred seniors, and emailed to another 30. The document will now be a monthly newsletter containing information about programs and activities at the Hart Park House.

SENIOR COMMUNITY COMMISSION

The August Senior Community Commission meeting was on Thursday, August 2. The August meeting was the first full meeting for newly appointed Commission Chair Bill Nelson. The agenda for the meeting included senior programs, community yard sale, and Wellness in the Park. Of the 7 seats on the Commission, five are currently filled. Five applications were received for the City Council's consideration; however one applicant has withdrawn their name; so there are currently 4 applicants. Consideration of Council appointments have been scheduled for the September 11th meeting.

COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Sierra Madre Coordinating Council resumed their regularly scheduled meetings on Thursday, August 2 at 12:00pm. The meeting was moved to the Council Chambers due to the YMCA summer program utilizing the Youth Activity Center. The August meeting was the first meeting after a two month hiatus. The Mt. Views News hosted a special 15 minute presentation for the August meeting.

WISTARIA VINE

Staff is working on creating the cover and the Community Services page for the upcoming fall Wistaria Vine. The fall issue of the Wistaria Vine is streamlined to an 8 page brochure to decrease printing costs. The fall edition is set to be mailed on Tuesday, September 4.

SENIOR SPECIALIST INTERVIEWS

Staff conducted first interviews for the Senior Specialist on July 30. Of the eight candidates interviewed, four were asked back for a second, group interview. The group interview is August 6 at the Hart Park House. Candidates will work together to create a senior program. Candidates will be evaluated in peer interaction, leadership, planning skills, time management and other skills.

OKTOBERFEST

The Oktoberfest Golf and Tennis Tournament Committee held its first meeting on July 31st. The date of the event was changed from October 13th to the 20th to ensure that the usual tennis courts and golf course would be available. As a result of the date change, the location for lunch was also moved from the Sierra Madre Room to the Hart Park House. During the meeting the Committee also discussed additional sponsorship, raffle, and goodie bag ideas. The Committee would like to continue to offer the towels and beer steins for participants.

SUMMER FUN IN THE PARK

Mission Renaissance presented again this past Tuesday for Summer Fun in the Park. Eighteen kids attend the drop-in program and learned to draw a mountain landscape with pastels. For the Thursday CATZ fitness program 15 youth attended and played various games including tag, Duck, Duck, Goose, and Octopus. The remaining four Tuesday presentations include the LA Zoo, Athens Services, LA County Arboretum, and the Sierra Madre Fire Department.

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

AUGUST 7 GENERAL PLAN STEERING COMMITTEE (GPSC) MEETING

The next regular GPSC meeting is August 7, 2012, at 6:00 p.m. (But the meeting will begin at the conclusion of the Special Council meeting.) Items on the agenda include subcommittee reports on their progress on various tasks to complete the draft General Plan document, and review of the estimated schedule to complete General Plan update, including preparation of the EIR and Planning Commission and City Council review.

1ST BUSINESS FORUM – IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MARKET DEMAND STUDY

The first Business Forum was held in Council Chambers last Wednesday, August 1st. The forum was well-attended with about 30 business owners in attendance. Mayor Pro Tem Walsh and Council Members Capoccia and Harabedian attended the meeting. Lisa Hill, Buxton, provided background on the study, describing how customer psychographics data, data which lists over 4,500 consumer products, can be used to Sierra Madre's businesses' benefit. Attendees received current consumer data including: household level demographic and psychographic detail and comparison, detailed household type reports, and household level Consumer Propensity Reports. Two additional dates replicating the Forum will take place, to provide as much opportunity for business owners to attend: Tuesday, August 21, 6:30-7:30 pm and Friday, September 14, 7:00-8:00 am.

DIGITAL STORYBOARDS

Members of the Friends of the Library, and Sierra Madre Historical Preservation Society joined staff on field trips to neighboring libraries to help evaluate digital storyboards. The Whittier Public Library was visited on Friday July 27 and the Rancho Cucamonga Public Library was visited on July 31. The attendees were able to see first-hand how these libraries stored local history images and made them accessible to the public. All who attended the field trip will be handing in evaluations answering questions such as:

- How do you think a unit like this could be used at our library?
- What is your impressions/recommendation of a digital storyboard?
- What history collections on the unit did you enjoy the most?

Staff is looking into possible funding sources for these units which can store and display up to 240 images in a space saving unit.

STAFFING

Interviews for a part-time library associate will be conducted the first week of August. Due to a recent staff resignation, this part time position has been fully funded for the 2012/2013 Fiscal Year.

Recruitment efforts are underway for a part-time library page with over 100 applications received. Interviews will be scheduled for later in August.

LOCAL HISTORY COLLECTION

Our library received a grant from the State of California in April of this year to help us assess and preserve our local history archives. Staff has completed a survey of the collection and have arranged for Susan Allen, Consultant of the California Preservation Assessment Project to visit the library on August 20 and 21st. Ms. Allen will provide a two-day site visit to assess collections using random sampling, an evaluation of facilities in which collections are housed, interview staff on the history of preservation problems in the collections; and provide a management report with key findings, recommendations for actions, and justifications for actions to reduce risks to access. History Librarian, Debbie Henderson, will be working closely with Ms. Allen throughout the process to develop and implement a plan that will ensure accessibility to our local archives.
